- Ensure that your child has a place to keep school folders/homework organized and a place to work on homework. Give the child time to work on the homework and encourage extra reading.
- Help your child organize their school clothes in the evening before going to bed and make sure he/she has an established bed time where at least 10 hours of sleep is availa-
- Keep up with the information the school sends and attend school functions with your child as often as possible. Being active helps assure the child that you are interested and hold education as a priority for your child.




