\$17 Million Renovation Begins at Suda E.

Project will take two summers to complete

Renovation work has finally begun on the 60-plus year-old Butler Traditional High School structure, but it will take a while to finish. "We are expecting the project to be completed by the beginning of school in 2017," said Paul Schardein, project coordinator and plant operator. There are two reasons for the length of the project, Paul explained. "We will still conduct classes during the school year so only limited work can be done during that time. And the other reason will be that the work being done is extensive."

Exactly what is planned? Mr. Schardein answered, "There is so much work that we can't list it all. The "big ticket" items are new systems throughout the school, including HVAC, hot water, windows, lights, PA, security, and fire. In addition, air conditioning will be added to the large gym, which opened in 1970."

These are the big projects, but there are other improvements and changes that will be made. The work will be done in two phases. The first phase will be in the area that existed when the school opened in 1954. The second phase will focus on the remainder of the building and some other items that may be added to the project later.

Construction work is nothing new to Butler but it has been a while. "People are surprised when we tell them where the building stopped when it was first built," said Fred Wright ('58 Class President). Chuckling, he continued, "Based on what we have now, the school wasn't that big when it opened. It seems like I

spent by entire high school career watching construction out the classroom windows."

After the work is complete, what will be most noticeable to a former Butler student? Paul Schardein replied, "The first thing you will notice will be a new front entrance design. We are removing lockers during both phases of the project so the halls will be wider and there will be

a lot 'new' open wall space. The windows will look different too. Not only will they save us thousands of dollars in heating costs, they are tinted to help keep the building cooler during hot weather. A few things they may not notice unless they look real close are the items that have been removed for the new HVAC. The original smoke stack has been torn down as it is no longer needed. The old boilers have been removed along with the large water heaters. Both have been replaced by smaller more efficient alternatives. The boiler room was very cramped now we have some breathing room.

But I think the one improvement that will be noticed the most will be the AC in the large gym. That is one of the hottest places you can be on an August afternoon. We've had to postpone events because of the heat. Even events in the fall, like the Veterans' Day program are uncomfortable. We've been waiting on this for a long time."

On May 23, SEBAA donated another \$10,000 for the school to use during the renovation. Brittany Campbell Braun '00 points out, "This brings our total 2016 donation to \$30,000. It is our goal to contribute at least \$50,000 to the school

during 2016. We have asked the school to use these funds to add improvements that are not included in the project. We also want the donation to impact as many students as possible."

Principal William Allen explains that SEBAA's donation is icing on the cake. "I'll be honest, when we received the first donation of \$10,000 we were caught off guard. We weren't expecting that kind of donation. Then, to our surprise, we received the second and now the third. This money will allow us to make other improvements that we had on our wish list." He continued, "The project includes a new sound system for the small gym. We want to install permanent bleachers, too. These will save us a lot of room and make the small gym more usable for performances, meetings and gatherings up to 250 people. We are also creating our third computer lab. This will have the most up-to-date equipment, and we will need help with furniture."

At SEBAA's request, Mr. Allen is thinking of a project that the alumni can embrace in 2017. He said "I'm working on that now and we will have a project the alumni will be proud of and be able to call their own."

"Old School" Items

School lockers, chemistry lab cabinet (glass front), maps that hung above the chalk boards, geometry and other math teaching aids are just some of the items uncovered as Suda E. is being cleared for its renovation. What does SEBAA plan to do with these items? "We plan to auction or sell most of these items but we are not sure what methods we will use," said Brenda Darnell Cease '67. "We know for sure we will have lockers available for \$20," she added.

Most of the items will be stored at school until August. Then we will need to move them off-site while the new alumni room is being remodeled. SEBAA is looking for a storage facility for this purpose. We would need about 100 square feet of space for about four months. The storage facility doesn't need to be climate-controlled but it does need to be dry. If you know someone that will help us out, please send us an email and we will follow up.
