# Small Gym is Now - Alumni Hall

#### More than 24,000 Alumni to be honored

The Jefferson County Board of Education has approved a motion to name Butler's small gymnasium Alumni Hall. Over the years, the gym has been referred to as the Gym, the Old Gym, the Girl's Gym and the Small Gym. Now it will have an official name. "This is long overdue," explains William Allen, principal. He continued, "The Alumni have always supported the school and continue to do so. There are not many schools in Jefferson County that can make this claim."

The Alumni Association was started 10 years ago. Since that time, the association has grown to over 1,600 members and has donated more than \$250,000 to the school. Fred Wright '58, the association's first president, commented, "I remember our first donation to the school. It was \$2,000 to purchase four iPads for the library." He laughed. "We were so proud of ourselves. We had no idea we would get to this point." The point Fred refers to is the most recent donation of \$90,000+ to upgrade the small gym (oops, Alumni Hall).



# SEBAA Donates \$90,000+ to Help Revive Performing Arts

Stage and Gym Upgrades Included in Largest Donation to Date

Recently the school approached SEBAA with a request to upgrade the small gym, primarily the stage, to revive the performing arts program. Butler has a long history of excellent school plays and musicals, but those stopped a few years ago. In fact, the stage often was used as a storage area. A real eyesore.

The performing arts program is being resurrected and band director Marc Monroe is leading the way. Marc produced a detailed plan and convinced the SEBAA board of directors that the school was serious and that he would see the project through. This donation would be focused on getting the stage, lights and sound systems to the point that performances would be possible again. "SEBAA's donation has provided us with a state-of-the-art performance space. The stage had become a barren space that was primarily used for storage. Thanks to the generous donation the stage will now be used for choir concerts, jazz band concerts, percussion ensemble concerts, schoolwide talent shows, plays, and the revived spring musical. Knight Audio, of Louisville, has been working since the start of the semester to install a brand-new lighting grid that includes all digital lighting and state-of-the-art intelligent lights that can be programmed to move.

In addition to the lighting system, the stage features 12 wireless microphones, four overhead microphones, a brand new sound system, new curtains, a mobile tech booth, a camera that gives us the ability to livestream any activity in the space, a wireless communication system for the tech crew, a curtain system to create an area for the pit orchestra during musicals and numerous other amenities that give our students a performance space that rivals any in JCPS," explained Marc Monroe, Performing Arts Department.

But that is not all. The spring musical, "All Shook Up," had some startup costs, so, included in the \$90,000 donation, is \$2,000 to cover licensing and royalty fees for the play. Marc Monroe explains, "This allows us to make attending the performance affordable for all students."
